Any pupil or member of staff who displays signs of being unwell, such as having a cough, fever or difficulty in breathing, and believes they have been exposed to coronavirus, is immediately taken out of the class and placed in an area where they will not come into contact with others and are supervised at all times. Where this is a child, the supervising member of staff will wear full PPE: mask, gloves, apron and visor (kept in the classrooms) whilst with the child. Once the child has been collected, that PPE must be carefully removed and double bagged – the waste must then be kept securely until the outcome of the child's Covid test is known – once known the PPE waste should be disposed of in accordance with up to date guidance The relevant member of staff calls for emergency assistance immediately if pupils' symptoms worsen. The parents of unwell pupils are informed as soon as possible of the situation by a relevant member of staff. Areas used by unwell staff and pupils who need to go home are appropriately cleaned once vacated, using a disinfectant and care to be taken when cleaning all hard surfaces. • If unwell pupils and staff are waiting to go home, they are instructed to use different toilets to the rest of the school to minimise the spread of infection.
